





Dursley Dozen 2019



After months of planning and preperation Sunday the 10th of February saw the 2019 version of the Dursley Dozen.

Tony Freer Race Director view on this was "What an amazing day, this time being the 30th running of this amazing event which attracts runners from as far as Cornwall to the south and Newcastle to the north and to crown things off the sun also made an appearance. As always, the success of this event is down to the Dursley Running Club members who, helped to mark the course, helped with parking, helped with set up, helped marshal, helped at HQ and lots of other jobs in between. The event wouldn't run without this support".

Well said Tony. This year race was marked by a larger than average turn out from DRC relfecting the growth of the club in recent years 75 entrants with over 60 DRC finishers. Raceday started early with set up at the Sporst Hall from 8am, number distribution, catering and back drop being sorted whilst car park marshalling was soon in swing. At the Town Hall the finish line was set up with the 30th anniversary tops ready for the finishers. Water stations were being set up and marshals making their way to their stations.

The weather was over cast and a chilly three degrees at the start of the morning. The athletes started to gather at the start form around 10:15 and the race started more or less on time at 10:30. As ever there was rush from May Lane up Hilll Road with the those with an eye on a top placing keen to get into the woods ahead for the masses. The masses knowing that there was along way to go at this point took a more considered approach to the first ascent. James Everett led the way for DRC. Dan Anderson and Paul Hocking not on the start line due to illness and injury, which was a blow to DRCs hopes of another win in the mens team race. James was concerned as one of his competitors started talking to him on the first climb, James was struggling to breath let alone talk! By the time the first runner, James Pictor came off the golf ourse road and into the woods he had just over a minutes advantage of James and Simon Byrne of Swindon Harriers. Xander McInnes was next in the woods for DRC around 2 minutes behind James. First woman at this stage was Annabel Grainger just three minutes behind the leader with Matt Read a minute behind Grainger. Next in was Ben Amigoni leading Haydn Smith by twenty metres or so with Chris Sweet in close attendance.

Nicki Morgan of Chepstow Harriers (F50) was second woman at the stage with a 3 minute deficit on Grainger. With two Thornbury runners in front of her Zoe Lammerton entered the woods as 5th woman with Margaret Johnson a minute or so back. By the time they reached the Quarry the leader Sam Pictor was now a clear two minutes a ahead of James who was working hard. He was now being chased by two runners who were within striking distance. Behind James the order had slightly changed Xander and Matt were now being chased by Haydn who had overtaken Ben, and Louis Rummer-

Downing was somewhere in the mix as well. NB if you don't wear a DRC vest yur are more or less invisible. In the woman's race Grainger has almost 5 minutes on Morgan now, with Zoe, running strongly, now moving in to third position a further two minute or so in arrears. DRC runners were now coming through the Quarry thick and fast, Margaret just in advance of Jadie Cotterell and Kim Bird both working hard. As ever there was plenty of support around the course for all the runners, and plenty of mini- DRC teams supporting each other on the way around.







As the runners ascended to the Golf course there was not much change in the key positions, with both the leading man and woman having commanding advantages that only a severe mishap would interfere with. Sam Pictor was a clear overall winner as was Annabel Grainger in the women's category. Pictor made it look all too easy, and some reseach has identified that 2018 was his first year as a professional triathlete!

Whilst Graingers run was a master class in form and concentration. James Everett came home second overall and first for DRC. He was really pleased with his run he said it felt "harder' but he ran "faster" which might explain why it felt harder, although conditions underfoot were definitely more testing than in 2018. Zoe Lammerton also continued to work hard to ensure she was not going to be caught on the run-in. She looked as strong as she had earlier on in the race as she started her decent in to Dursley.

Zoe lead a strong DRC women's performance, with the team of Zoe, Margaret and Jadie first Female Team. Kim, Alice Lewis and Line Whitlock placing 3rd female team. Despite missing two key runners the DRC men's team manged second place behind local rivals Thornbury with James , Xander, Haydn and Matt counting with Ben, Louis, Chris and Kevin Jackson coming home as fifth male team. At least two personal best on the a day although every Dozen is unique, Damian Lai and Louise Biddell were very pleased to smash their previous best on the course.

Congratulations to all those for whom it was Dozen Debut, with Margaret Badger and Hannah Osbourne vowing to marshal in 2019! Super effort by Nicki "I don't do off road" Cowle sweeping up with ben Houghton and Margaret B to finish in 03:29:10.













The trio of sweepers did an excellent job picking up the course from the rear thereby ensuring that no one has to go back out after the race to pick up the course markings as members did in yesteryear. So a huge thankyou to Rachel, Janet and Liz Halford how had retired hurt before the ascent of the precipice.
