

Dursley Sinners in Action

A group of Dursley Runners made their way to The Forest of Dean for the first of the 2017 Seven Sins hat trick of races being held on Thursday 28th, Friday 29th and Saturday 30th December. A regular on the running calendar the Seven Sins is an off road race which incorporates seven hills in a little over seven miles with two under road river tunnels for good measure with around 1000 feet of ascent and descent. Keen to work off the Christmas excess (GLUTTONY) and shake the self-induced torpor of the festive season (SLOTH) the Dursley Runners were defiant in the face of some very wintry conditions.

A very hard frost following the previous days snow had left the route snowy, frozen, boggy and waterlogged in pretty much equal measure with firm sections being a rarity. The race organisers felt that the first river tunnel section was too hazardous for runners because of the depth of the river and the speed of the current and a road diversion excluded this first subterranean river immersion. At the stroke of ten some 160 plus runners set off along one of the few firm path sections and headed up the first and biggest of the seven climbs. Dave Wood tried a measured approach but by the first descent the thrill of the kamikaze downhill overwhelmed him and he sought out these sections with increasing desire (GREED).

Mouse (acting as pacer for his better half Den) and Den Evans (honorary member but affiliated to Glos AC) adopted a steadier approach, but nevertheless made good progress. Caroline Jones and Chris Sweet were sporting previous years Seven Sins technical T's, with pride. Chris had started strongly and was at the sharp end of the race field and Caroline was making steady progress behind Den and Mouse a little further down the field. As the bitingly cold air rasped in the runners lungs the familiar heady descents and heart breaking ascents repeated again and again and the desperate need to finish and end the misery became a consuming desire (LUST).

Dave soon found a pattern in his race

overtaking on the more level sections and descents and losing ground on the steep uphill but he continued to gain places nonetheless with Chris still running strongly. The final descent proved to contain some of the trickiest and boggiest ground yet encountered and the expected speedy descent to the finish and the final river/tunnel crossing was negated by the strength sapping morass. An obscured marker in the final half mile caused Dave Mouse and



Den to go off course at this most crucial point of the race with all three losing between 30 and 60 seconds as well as a handful of valuable places. This caused a brief moment of angry frustration (WRATH) and in his desire to regain the lost places Dave threw himself into the river/tunnel crossing only to lose his footing and fall into the ice cold

thigh deep water of the tunnel(HUBRIS). He resurfaced to be first Dursley finisher in 23rd position overall (4th MV50) in 1-05-13 just pipping Chris Sweet who finished in 1-05-19 in 25th position overall (4th MV40). Dave spent the remainder of his day eyeing up the "sub 60 T shirts" (ENVY) awarded to those runners who finish the course in under 60 minutes (envy). Den and Mouse finished in 1-14-57 and 1-14-58 respectively, with Den collecting the FSVet (1st LV50) prize and finishing 5th lady overall (PRIDE). Caroline ran a determined race and finished strongly in 1-21-25 and was 13th lady overall out of the 51 female finishers.

The male winner was Rob Bowery who finished the race in an impressive 54-21 with the first female finisher Claudia Wilesmith in 1-05-11. The final results recorded 163 male and female finishers in the



Thursday Seven Sins event. Every finisher received a stylish Seven Sins "Gluttony" medal before withdrawing to their cars for warm and dry clothing. (thank you Dave Wood for the write up!).

The Seven Sins was followed up by a couple of rearranged races with the Westonbirt House 10K and Severn AC Boxing Day four miler both rejigged due to snow with the Wye Wander and Gloucester 10 sandwiched in-between, the latter meaning a few runners had consecutive races to the end the year on!

Westonbirt House 10K

Seventeen DRC athletes were on the start line Westonbirt House event. The club had two runners finishing in the top twenty, James Price running strongly to come home first for DRC at the with Mark Sprigings just 45 seconds behind him, placing 5th and 7th senior males respectively.







Behind them a posse of runners came in comfortably under the hour, with Louise Biddell, looking good as the first DRC woman in, with Steve Barnes pacing sixth M60. Just on the other side of sixty minutes Eileen Hieron finished 2nd V70. Louise Beck and Cara Zoglowek both finished under eighty minutes and could look forward to putting their feet before the Gloucester 10 Mile the following day.
